Dear Friends and Neighbors,

At long last spring and warm weather have arrived and the Town has a fantastic schedule of events and activities planned for the upcoming summer season. Please take the time to read the articles describing these many fun activities, including our Tugboat Roundup and Steamboat Meet, the summer recreation program, and of course, our weekly Farmers Market which is held waterside every Sunday morning starting June 9th. We ask that you take special note of the Town's annual Memorial Parade which will take place on Wednesday May 22nd under the direction of Tom Doin. While the parade is always a fun filled event, please make every effort to attend both the parade and the memorial service that immediately follows the parade's conclusion at Soldiers and Sailors Park. Let's all show our appreciation for those who have served our nation both past and present.

The Town Board is currently reviewing several options that will make long needed repairs and improvements to the Senior Citizens Center. Plans for the improvements will be finalized over the next several months and we hope construction will begin before year end.

Governor Cuomo and Senator Schumer have very recently announced Waterford is eligible for a potential grant of up to \$3 million to address the cost of damage and potential community improvements necessary as a result of hurricanes Irene and Sandy. We are waiting for additional details regarding the program and the town and village governments will be working closely together to take advantage of this opportunity.

As many of you will recall, the Town engaged in a difficult and long battle with the Federal Environmental Protection Agency to recover the additional costs that town residents would incur to purchase water from Troy during the Hudson River Dredging project. As a result of these efforts, I am pleased to report to you that the Waterford Water Authority has received a total of \$366,612 and are due an additional \$141,090 from the EPA.

On behalf of all of the elected officials and Town employees, we wish you and your family a wonderful and safe summer!

MEDICATION DROP BOX

Unwanted, unused or expired prescription drugs have been determined to present substantial risks to our community by either falling into the wrong hands, or by damaging our environment through improper disposal. Working together, the Town of Waterford Police Department, the Town Supervisor and the Town Board have secured a safe alternative method to dispose of unwanted pharmaceuticals.

In conjunction with the New York State Department of Health we are pleased to announce the installation of a secure drop-box at the Police Department. Community members are now welcome to come to the Department where unwanted medications may be turned in anonymously. **Medications in standard containers may be deposited in those containers. Loose medications should be placed in zip lock bags and then deposited**. <u>*Please* ensure that any liquid medications are enclosed in leak proof containers before depositing. We do not accept hypodermic needles or syringes.</u> Once collected, all medications will be disposed of according to State and Federal laws.



The Medication Drop Box is open to members of the <u>community only</u>. <u>It is not open to pharmacies, veterinarians,</u> <u>pharmaceutical businesses, or any entity other than a private household</u>.

Medications, including controlled substances, may be dropped off Monday through Friday from 12 Noon until 8 PM only. If you have any questions please feel free to call the Town of Waterford Police Department at 237-3341.

Town Court Matters

Waterford Town Court is pleased to report that it has received a New York State grant in the amount of \$3,200 through the Justice Court Assistance Program (JCAP). The JCAP program was established by the New York State Legislature in 1999, at the request of the Unified Court System, to help provide justice courts with the resources and equipment necessary to fulfill their critical role in our justice system. The grant program provides support directly to towns and villages to improve the administration of justice and the appearance of Justice Courts.

The Court received grant monies in 2012 and a portion of those monies went toward the construction of offices for both prosecutors and defense attorneys toward the back of the existing court-room. The construction project is complete, and the two new offices have been utilized for nearly a year now and have greatly facilitated both prosecution and defense counsel in their ability to conduct private negotiation with attorneys and clients, as well as allowing for additional office space available to town employees throughout the week. The funds from this new grant will go toward obtaining appropriate furnishings for these offices, as well as other necessary office equipment for the court.

Judge Fusco and Judge Sunukjian hold court on Thursday evenings at 6pm. The Assistant District Attorney and Public Defender are in court every second and fourth Thursday. Small Claims must be filed in person with the clerk of the court during normal business hours.

Assessor News and Notes Most residents know that the State has a new plan to require all Basic STAR applicants to register with the State Tax Department to receive or continue receiving STAR.

But the State's much publicized plan to require new applications for STAR is not so bad after all. It will not affect this year's STAR program. And it will not involve the Senior (or Enhanced) STAR plan at all.

The proposal is to have the State, next fall, notify <u>existing</u> Basic STAR recipients when it is time to re-register. <u>New applicants</u> will file for the exemption in the usual way through the Assessor's Office.
